Abraham's promise (heir of the world) came through faith's righteousness, not law; law brings wrath, but faith ensures grace for all

Gentile's shame. Faith, Not Law (Romans 4:13-15):

- Justification by faith, not works, frees both sons to serve joyfully at the father's table. Lessons: Reject guilt from self, others (e.g., firstborn's judgment), or past sins; trust Christ's death and resurrection to stand righteous, reinstating purpose and relationship with

God.

Abraham's Faith for All (Romans 4:16-17): The promise is by faith, not law, making Abraham father of all who believe (Genesis 17:5)—Jews by lineage, Gentiles by faith—uniting both sons without favoritism.
