- exemplified by Antipas' martyrdom (v. 12-13). · Yet, He rebukes their tolerance of Balaam-like teachings (idolatry, sexual sin) and Nicolaitans, calling for repentance to avoid His judgment (v. 14-16). Victors receive hidden manna, a white stone, and a

- new name (v. 17). Mercy calls for purity amid worldly entanglement.
  - Application: Endure persecution like Smyrna with faithfulness, trusting Jesus' victory; reject compromise like Pergamum's, repenting of worldly mixture—mercy empowers steadfastness and purity for eternal reward.
