Introduction

Matthew 15:1-20

In Matthew 15:1-20, Jesus addresses the issue of trusting in the commandments of God rather than the traditions of men as

violence, our natural reactions may lead us to rely on the dark world, self-help, or cultural traditions. However, Jesus teaches His disciples that these human rules are burdens that weigh down people's souls and hinder their growth and productivity as Kingdom citizens. He promises rest for those who come to Him, acknowledging the burdens they carry, and warns against the dangers of bad, erroneous, and cultic teachings.
