# A great multitude was saved and sealed during the tribulation time

Session Number: 15 | Week: 3 | Day: 1

## **Bible Passage**

Revelation 7: 9-17

#### Introduction

In this session, chapter 7: 9-17, we focus on the salvation that will take place during tribulations. First mentioned here were the Jewish brothers of Jesus. Just like the brothers of Jesus believed in him after his death. There will be some Jesus' brothers (Jews) who will believe after the church is taken away, these are the 144000 evangelists. These Jewish evangelists believed after the tribulation and started to preach, and the results of their preaching were the great multitude in white robes

# **Session Objectives**

By the end of this session, the learner will have:

- Understood that preaching, believing, and worship shall continue after the tribulation has started by comparing the verses given about the tribes of Israel, both in the OT and NT.
- Appreciated the appropriate and inappropriate responses after tribulation has started by comparing the people in Rev 6: 15-17 and Rev 7: 9-10.
- Appreciated the angelic ministries to the people of God by comparing their activities before, during, and after the tribulation had started.

#### **Session Outline**

- Jesus' brother believed after the rapture
- Ministry of angels in sealing the servants of God and worshipping God
- A great multitude in white robes

# Connecting

- Study together in a group of two or more people.
- Begin with a prayer, asking God to bless your understanding.
- Read the passage at least twice using different Bible versions, then retell the story among your group members.
- Share the challenges and blessings from the previous day.

## Comprehending

- Read 7: 9-10. What happened after the preaching by the 144000 Jewish Evangelists during the tribulation?
- Read 7: 9-10, 13-17. Describe the post-tribulation saints: Who
  were these converts? How many were they? Where did they
  come from? How were they clothed? What were they doing at
  the throne? what was their end?
- Read Rev 7: 11-12. What were the responses of angelic beings standing around the throne after the conversion of multitudes after tribulation has started?

## Committing

- Engage with the Bible—read, study, memorize, meditate, pray, listen, and live it out.
- List three lessons you learnt as an agent of change that you would practice and teach others about
- Take time and worship Jesus with the attributes revealed about Christ now.
- Engage SPACEPETS model, to do something after the session. Look for:
  - Sin to confess
  - Promise to claim
  - Attitude to change
  - Command to keep
  - Error to change
  - Prayer to make
  - **Example** to copy
  - Truth to obey and
  - Something praiseworthy

# Revelation 7:9-17

# Context:

- Following the sealing of the 144,000 in Revelation 7:1-8, John's vision shifts to a great multitude saved during the tribulation, post-rapture, amidst God's judgments on a sinful world.
- The church, already raptured, is absent, but God's mercy continues to draw people from all nations to salvation through the tribulation's trials.
- Great Multitude Saved (Revelation 7:9-17):

- A vast, uncountable multitude from every nation, tribe, people, and language stands before the throne and the Lamb, clothed in white robes, praising God for salvation (v. 9-10).
- Angels, elders, and living creatures join in worship, affirming God's glory, wisdom, and power (v. 11-12).
- These are identified as those who came out of the great tribulation, washed in the Lamb's blood, now serving God day and night, protected and comforted by His presence (v. 13-17).
- Mercy is extended as God gathers Gentiles alongside Jews, offering salvation even in judgment, fulfilling His promise of redemption.

# Application:

 Rejoice in God's boundless mercy that saves a multitude through tribulation; cling to Jesus now, sharing the gospel urgently, so others may join the redeemed before the day of the Lord, secure in His salvation.
